Interdisciplinary Approach

DeKalb Medical Long Term Acute Care's wound care program is designed for patients with impaired tissue integrity related to vascular or medical factors or infections. These patients require careful monitoring by nursing, dietary, and rehabilitative therapies. The plan of care for many of these patients involves the primary wound treatment, as well as treatment of a secondary set of problems, including generalized weakness, infections, or nutritional problems. A plan of care specific to that patient is developed in collaboration with the Wound Care team and the physician.
